Participating Hospitals by 2023 Initiatives

No Quality without Equity PQC Pennsylvania Perinatal Quality Collaborative 63 hospitals, representing 82.5% of live births in PA

46 Substance-Exposed Newborns (NAS)

56 Maternal Substance Use (OUD)

22 Immediate Postpartum LARC

23 Moving on Maternal Depression (MOMD) *SUSTAINING*

23 Severe Hypertension Treatment (Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health) *SUSTAINING*

Because of YOUR Hard Work!

From 70% in 2022 to 83% of newborn care teams *educated on post-discharge* services

From **75%** in 2022 to **84%** of newborns with NAS receiving **non-pharmacotherapy bundled treatments**

From 30% in 2022 to 44% of hospitals with a protocol to *close the loop* on the referral status with the post-discharge services and supports

From 10% in 2022 to 27% of hospitals with *trauma-informed protocols* in the context of substance use

From 8% in 2022 to 30% of hospitals with a system in place to provide *naloxone* to at risk patients *prior to discharge*


Maternal Initiatives



Neonatal Initiatives







- One \$5,000 award each quarter
- Virtual Learning Sessions
 - Quality Improvement
 - Content related to Key Interventions
 - Peer-to-Peer learning
- Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health Resources
 - Webinars
 - Implementation Resources
 - Communities of Learning
- Participating Sites will need to complete a MOU/DUA

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- Initiative is designed by a group of experts and meant to support birthing sites that (1) have already implemented PA Safe Sleep or Cribs for Kids as well as (2) sites that have not yet implemented one of these evidence-based programs
- Expansion beyond evidence-based programs focused on inpatient stay
 - Four-tiered focus
 - Healthcare professionals understand, endorse, and model safe sleep practices.
 - 2. Infant caregivers have knowledge, skills, and feel empowered to implement safe sleep practices.
 - 3. Community champions promote safe sleep.
 - 4. Policies support and facilitate safe sleep practices.
 - Works in conjunction with programs such as Cribs for Kids, PA Safe Sleep, etc.
 - Consistent messaging from inpatient education is reinforced in outpatient and community settings through partnerships

Poster Specifications

Poster Size and Submission Guidelines

- Only one poster per Healthcare Team is required, regardless of number of participating initiatives
- Healthcare Teams will be required to submit an electronic copy of their poster to their PQC QI coach via email by **April 30, 2024** and print a hard copy to display at the meeting
- This will count as your QI report out for whichever initiative you choose (for example if your team participates in both OUD and NAS, you can create a poster for NAS then submit your usual QI report via LifeQI for OUD).

Printing your poster:

- Posters must be no wider than 3 feet, though can be smaller than this
- You may choose to create and print a large scientific poster, or share your information in a PPT (print one slide per page to hang on the display boards with thumb tacks)
- Instructions for locating display area and push pins for displaying posters will be provided at registration.

Mercer County NAS Symposium May 23, 2024



OVERVIEW

NAS stands for Neonatal Abstinence
Syndrome. This is a condition that occurs when
infants are exposed to drugs that cause
dependency while in-utero. This condition can
cause a range of symptoms beginning at birth.
The purpose of the symposium is to educate
attendees on the condition and effective
interventions and resources for children
affected by NAS, their families, and those
tasked with supporting them.

DETAILS

The Symposium is being hosted by Mercer County Children and Youth Services in collaboration with the Mercer County Behavioral Health Commission, PA Department of Health, Adagio Health, and Pennsylvania Prenatal Quality Collaborative with additional support from Dr. John Gallagher. The symposium will be held at Thiel College, Howard Miller Student Center, Mercer County Pa. Lunch will be provided, as well as resource materials at the conclusion of the event. The event is limited to 150 guests on a first-registration basis with a targeted audience of social work, medical, and education professionals. 
